What do we not trust? (Proverbs 3:5)
Is there a difference between "trust" and "lean"? I say, "No". They have basically the same meaning. Isn't leaning on something sturdy a comforting thing? Remember having to stand in a line for a long time, and then getting to lean against something if no chair was available?
We want to lean on things. It's almost relaxing for a while. Can't you almost hear God say, "Go ahead – lean on me. I won't let you fall." In fact, leaning is like resting while you are standing.

Are the meanings the same? Again, I think not. "Ways" describes what we do each day to live, making decisions big or small, getting where you need to go; all the regular stuff. "Paths" describes our "ways" after we recognize (acknowledge) that God is in control of our "ways" and wants to turn those "ways" into "paths" on which He can guide us & prosper us.
