2. Briefly explain how Ezra begins (Ezra 1:1-3)

Ezra is divided into two parts as you can see in the outline above. Ezra wrote both parts but here is the difference: Ezra was not born yet when the events in Ezra 1-6 took place. He actually was in Jerusalem when Ezra 7-10 took place.

The Babylonians defeated Judah & hauled many off to Babylon in 586 B.C. While the Jews were exiled in Babylon, Persia defeated Babylon in 539 B.C. So now, 47 years later, The Nation of Israel is in exile under the control of Cyrus, king of Persia.

4. What did King Cyrus decide to do? (Ezra 1:2)

His decision would require the Jews to return to Jerusalem & their home towns.

Some think that Sheshbazzar (Ezra 1:11) and Zerubbabel (Ezra 2:2) are the same person. Either way, they or he led caravans back to the Land of Israel. The purpose of this group was to rebuild the temple & restore the worship system.
