This is the fourth book in the series written by Ezra: 1 & 2 Chronicles, Ezra, NEHEMIAH about the return of the nation of Israel to their land.

Remember that **Zerubbabel** brought the first group back to Jerusalem **to rebuild the temple** (in the book of Ezra).

Remember that **Ezra** brought the second group back to Jerusalem **to rebuild the spiritual life of the people** (in the book of Ezra).

Now, we have **Nehemiah** bringing a third group back to Jerusalem **to rebuild the** city walls of Jerusalem (in the book of Nehemiah) (13 years after Ezra came).

Nehemiah gets permission from the Persian king to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the city walls. This was no minor job.
