Obviously, the next big empire to arise is the Babylonians (same as Chaldeans).

The prophets are busy: while Habakkuk is warning Judah, the other prophets warning & preaching in the same period of time prior to the destruction in 586 BC are probably: Zephaniah, Jeremiah, Obadiah.

After the destruction & exile of Judah took place, Jeremiah kept ministering while in exile; so did Ezekiel & Daniel.

- *OK, back to Habakkuk. He is concerned about the ways things are going with Judah. He is actually blaming God that Judah is living in wickedness & evil. He asked God two questions.*
