## The Song of Solomon is referred to in the Hebrew text as the "Song of Songs" (maybe a very special song to Solomon).

If Solomon reigned over Israel from roughly 970 B.C. to 931 B.C. (beginning of his reign until his death), he probably wrote or collected the material for all three books (Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon) while he was king.

## HOWEVER .... Why can't it be a poetic play describing the love of a man for a woman and of a woman for a man. I think it is.


2. How does the book start? (SS 1:1)

The words of the young woman **begin** ("kiss me") & **end** the poem ("come to me").

The Shulamite woman was a real person from a real place called Shulem or Shunam on this map: 10 miles from Nazareth 21 miles from Sea of Galilee at the foot of Mt. Moreh.

*Some historical things happened there which put it on the map for us.*

  - e. Elisha raised a son to life



It appears that King Solomon did some traveling (if he actually went on these trips).
