## HERE WE HAVE THE CONTENTS OF A CONFESSION. (Psalm 51)

**1Have mercy** on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

**2Wash** away all my iniquity and **cleanse** me from my sin. 3For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. 4Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge. 5Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. 6Yet you desired faithfulness even in the womb; you taught me wisdom in that secret place.

<u>7Cleanse</u> me with hyssop, and I will be clean; <u>wash</u> me, and I will be whiter than snow. 8Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice. 9<u>Hide</u> your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity. 10<u>Create</u> in me a pure heart, O God, and <u>renew</u> a steadfast spirit within me. 11Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me.

**12Restore** to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me. 13Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you. 14**Deliver** me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, you who are God my Savior, and my tongue will sing of your righteousness.

<u>150pen</u> my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise. 16You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. 17My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise.
