4 Few	Thoughts:
•	This church is held in Philemon's home (in Colosse). Apphia could be Philemon's wife; Archippus could be Philemon's son. Some think that Archippus was serving as the pastor of the Colossian church. It is assumed that since the Colossian church and the Laodicean church were only 12 miles apart, that the letter to the Colossians would have been shared with the Laodiceans. The letter to Philemon is more personal and was not necessarily shared.

To make things worse, Onesimus needed money to travel; he probably stole from Philemon. Remember the last time you had to forgive someone? Describe how that went.
