FEAR OF THE LORD

There are two meanings for "fear". One is "reverence"; one is "to be afraid".

BEING AFRAID (Not the focus of this lesson)

- 1. The Bible is full of "fear nots" so we know two things here:
 - a. First, some of the meanings definitely has to do being scared.
 - b. Second, God understands that we are afraid sometimes.

To "fear the Lord" is to start the path to knowledge. "Knowledge" is what is gathered over time through study of the Scriptures. "Wisdom" is the proper application of knowledge. It decides how to use it.							
Examples:	Knowledge understands that the traffic light has turned red. Wisdom prompts the person to apply the car brakes. Knowledge sees the quicksand coming up. Wisdom prompts the person to walk around it. Knowledge memorizes the Ten Commandments. Wisdom prompts the person to obey them. Knowledge learns about Who God is. Wisdom prompts the person to love God.						
Fearing the	Lord = Wisdom using knowledge to live a life pleasing to God.
