## **REDEMPTION**

Let's look in the Old Testament first to understand "redemption".

Isaiah 41:14 - Fear not, you worm Jacob, you men of Israel! I will help you, says the Lord and your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel.

This prophesy (prediction) from Isaiah is written to the exiled Jews in Babylon. God is promising to "deliver" them from their current imprisonment.

The "Consolation of Israel" means "the Messiah, the anointed One Who will deliver the Nation of Israel"; in other words, the Redeemer. However, many of today's Jews do not believe that Jesus is that Messiah. They are still waiting.
