The words "I am" = an eternal existence of present tense. He has always existed. Everything that matters in life comes from Him; all power comes from Him; He is God Almighty.

I AM THE TRUE VINE.

Some Thoughts:

- I am sure you are convinced that the "Vineyard" = The Nation of Israel.
- The "Vineyard" contains many "vines"; those "vines" = the people of Israel.
- During some parts of Israel's history, there was a vine on their coins; thus, the "vine" was a symbol for Israel.

THE NEW TESTAMENT DISCUSSION OF THE VINE

- John 15:1 (Jesus is speaking.) I am the True Vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.
- John 15:4 I am the Vine; you are the branches.
- John 15:2a My Father cuts off every branch in Me that bears no fruit.
- John 15:2b My father prunes every branch that bears fruit, so that it will bear more fruit.
- John 15:4 If you are attached to Me (the Vine), you will bear fruit; you need Me to bear fruit.
- John 15:6 If you are attached to Me and bear no fruit, you are cut off, thrown away, and burned.

Some Thoughts:

- Jesus was talking to the 11 disciples in a garden after they left the upper room.
- Jesus = True Vine; Father = Gardener; 11 Disciples = Fruitful branches; Judas = Unfruiitful
- Since all the disciples were Jewish, they were all attached to the Vine (Israel).

- A Jew in the Bible could only have the outward appearance of attachment to the Vine.

Being a human being does not make you a believer; accepting Jesus Christ as your personal Savior makes you a believer and immediately a fruitful branch.

The Vinedresser (farmer) (The Father) does two things here:

- 1) Judges the false & unfruitful branches (unbelievers sent to hell).
- 2) Prunes the true & fruitful branches (believers living righteousness).

John 15:8 God the Father is honored & glorified when His pruning causes you to produce more fruit; more fruit proves you are a disciple of Jesus Christ.
