
BIBLE RUNAWAYS

There were at least 11 Bible characters who "ran away" when things got tough. They are: Adam, Jonah, Elijah, Mark, Onesimus, Moses, Gideon, Prodigal Son, David, Judas Iscariot, and Peter.

Runaway #7 - Gideon

The name "Gideon" means "great warrior". It appears that Gideon did not know this.



This map lesson is in preparation for studying about Gideon. If we understand where he lived, who lived around him, and what were the reasons for his attitudes, it might help us understand him.

- 7. After Moses killed the Egyptian in Exodus 2:12, he left Egypt quickly and got on the road heading toward Midian. Put a "7" on the arrow line showing this.
- 8. When Joseph was sold by his brothers, the Midianites and Ishmaelites who bought him got on the road going from Midian to Egypt. **Put an "8" on the arrow line showing that**.

It is possible that the Land of Midian (also called the "Country of the East") stretched north a long way during the time of Gideon. See the large oval shape covering "Midian" on the map. That large oval area could be the area patrolled by Midian. If that is true, then the Midianites would have been very close to where Gideon lived & tried to farm.

A Few Thoughts:

- Notice that one of the sons from Abraham & Keturah was named "Midian"
- His descendants settled on the east side of top of the Red Sea and became a large nation.
- They were called the "Midianites".
- As you can see from map #2, the territory the Midianites controlled could have extended from the top of the Red Sea all the way into southern Israel (very close to Gideon territory).
- The descendants of Ishmael (Ishmaelites) and the descendants of Abraham's son Midian (Midianites) were the result of disobedience, immorality, and being driven from God.
- The decisions that Abraham made created other nations that hated Israel, rejected God, and planned harm & defeat to come to the Jewish people. (This was not God's fault.)
- Is it any wonder that Gideon doubted the faithfulness of God; men were evil & God got blamed.
