

MAKING A CHANGE - Joseph

Genesis 37:1-5 - Jacob lived in the land where his father, Isaac, settled. Here is some family history. His 17-year-old son, Joseph, was tending the flocks with his brothers, sons of different mothers. He brought a bad report about them to his father, Jacob. Now Jacob loved Joseph more than any of the other sons, because he had been born to him in his old age; Jacob made him a fancy coat of many colors. When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than them, they hate him and could not speak a kind word to him. Joseph had a dream and told it to his brothers; they hated him more.

Genesis 37:12-35 - The brothers went to feed their father's flocks - Jacob told Joseph to go see if all was well with the brothers - Joseph asked for directions - I am seeking my brothers; please tell me where they are feeding their flocks - When they saw him coming, they conspired to kill him - The oldest brother, Reuben, said they could not kill him; he said to throw him in a pit. They took his fancy coat and then threw him in a pit - then they sat down and ate a meal - they dipped the coat in blood and took it home to their father and lied that he was killed by a beast.

Genesis 42:21-24 - "We are guilty; when we sold him, he pleaded for mercy but we would not listen to him." Joseph overheard; he turned away and cried.

Genesis 50:19-20 - Do not be afraid, for I am in the place where God wants me. Years ago, you meant evil for me but God used it for good so that now I can protect and care for you. And he comforted them AND SPOKE KINDLY TO THEM.
