

## MAKING A CHANGE - Manasseh

Life is full of change. Sometimes, the changes we make are not good. However, don't forget the positive changes you have made. Let's check out a Biblical case study.

	asseh was 12 when he became king. He reigned 55 years in Jerusalem but he did in the sight of the Lord.

4.	Manasseh watched his father stand up for God and fight for a holy & righteous kingdom. When he entered leadership, he was only 12. What decisions could he have already made for his own life?
5.	Since he was only a kid, the leaders in the government who served his father would still have been in leadership, running the kingdom for him. He would probably have seen godly decisions being made. He became an evil king. What happened?
6.	Why do you think God allowed Manasseh to be king of Israel for 55

2 Chronicles 32:33 - 33:2 - So Hezekiah rested with his fathers; he prospered in all his works. They buried him and honored him. Then Manasseh his son reigned in his place.

2 Chronicles 33:10-13 - And the Lord spoke to Manasseh but he would not listen. Therefore, God brought the armies of Assyria against Israel and hauled Manasseh off in chains to Babylon. Now when Manasseh was suffering arrest in prison, he begged the Lord and humbled himself greatly before the Lord, and prayed to him. God heard him and brought him back to Jerusalem to resume being king. THEN MANASSEH KNEW THAT THE LORD WAS GOD.
