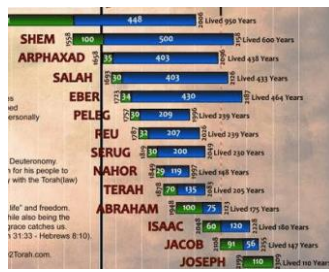
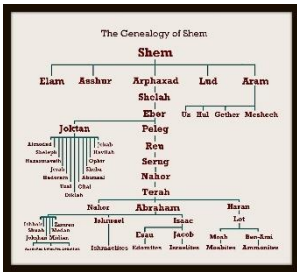
# HERE I AM, LORD

## LESSON 5 - Jacob

If you were with us for the last lesson featuring "Ananias", I think that we came to an amazing conclusion: God was not looking for results/victory ALL AROUND Ananias, BUT RATHER victory/results INSIDE Ananias.

NOW ON TO JACOB. DID HE ACTUALLY TELL GOD, "HERE I AM, LORD"? (Oh brother!???)

In my opinion, Jacob is disqualified from serving God in any way. (Don't throw this lesson in the trash yet.)



These charts tell us the following things:

- Shem, Noah's son, is an ancestor of Jacob.
- Shem was born 3120 years before Jacob was.
- Abraham was Jacob's grandfather.
- Isaac was Jacob's father.
- Esau was Jacob's brother.

Gen 29:31-35 Leah conceived, bore a son, and named him Reuben,<sup>[a]</sup> because she was saying, "The LORD had looked on my torture, so now my husband will love me. Later, she conceived again, bore a son, and declared, "Because the LORD heard that I'm neglected, he gave me this one, too." So she named him Simeon. Later, she conceived again and said, "This time my husband will become attached to me, now that I've borne him three sons." So he named him Levi. Then she conceived yet again, bore a son, and said, "This time I'll praise the LORD." So she named him Judah. Then she stopped bearing children.

11.  Yes  No Are these good reasons to have children?

*Gen 30:1-7 Rachel noticed that she was not bearing children for Jacob, so because she envied her sister Leah, she told Jacob, "If you don't give me sons, I'm going to die!" That made Jacob angry with Rachel, so he asked her, "Can I take God's place, who has not allowed you to conceive? Rachel responded, "Here's my handmaid Bilhah. Go have sex with her. She can bear children on my knees so I can have children through her." So Rachel gave Jacob her woman servant Bilhah to be his wife, and Jacob had sex with her. Bilhah conceived and bore a son for Jacob. Then Rachel said, "God has vindicated me! He has heard my voice and has given me a son." Therefore, she named him Dan. Rachel's servant conceived again and bore a second son for Jacob,<sup>8</sup> so Rachel said, "I've been through a mighty struggle with my sister and won." She named him Naphtali.*

- *The wives were competing with each other as to how to please their husband, Jacob, by having more children.*
- *The reasons for having the children revealed deep sadness in the lives of these women.*
- *The dysfunction of this family continued and some of the sons made very poor choices.*
