

## THE FATHER ISAAC BECAME

- Gen. 24:2-4 So Abraham instructed his servant, who was the oldest member of his household and in charge of everything he owned, "Make this solemn oath to me<sup>[a] 3</sup> as a promise to the LORD, the God of heaven and earth, that you won't acquire a wife for my son from the Canaanite women among whom I'm living. <sup>4</sup> Instead, you are to go to my country and to my family and acquire a wife for my son Isaac."

## Look Closer

- Abraham's servant traveled back to Mesopotamia where Abraham came from in the first place.
- The girl he met was named Rebekah.
- Even though his extended family worshipped idols, he wanted Isaac's wife from his own people.
- Rebekah was the grand-daughter of his brother.
- Rebekah agreed to come & she & Isaac married.
