### A Few Introductory Points

- King Saul was the first king of United Israel (1 Sam. 10:20). He was not related to Judah.
- King David was the second king of United Israel (2 Sam. 2:4). He was related to Judah.
- King Solomon was the third king of the United Israel (1 Kings 1:43) Son of King David
- King Rehoboam was the fourth king of the United Israel (1 Kings 11:43) Son of King Solomon
- The Kingdom of Israel split into two kingdoms: Rehoboam ruled the Southern Kingdom ("Judah")

Jeroboam ruled the Northern Kingdom ("Israel")

## LET'S FOCUS IN ON DAVID'S SELECTION AS KING

9. God had a plan; He told it to the Prophet Samuel. What was the plan? (1 Sam. 16:1)

10. \_\_Yes \_\_No Does God still have a plan even if things seemed impossible? (1 Sam. 16:2)

Notice this. God knew what He was doing. (1 Sam. 16:1-13)

- God selected a certain man's family & called him by name.
- God picked a certain Jewish tribe in a certain town.
- God said He would pick one of the sons in that family. "I will point him out to you."
- God said to Samuel, "This is the one." (1 Sam. 16:12)

John 15:16 - You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.

#### This is Jesus' Farewell Conversation with the Disciples (John 13-17)

- Jesus loved these men; He walked with these men; He put His arms around these men.
- They had supper together sometime in the late afternoon; He washed their feet; He send Judas Iscariot out to do his betrayal; He warned Peter that he would deny he knew Jesus; He told them about their heavenly home; He promised He would send the Holy Spirit; IT WAS A BUSY EVENING!!

- When their conversation was over, they walked to the garden in the dark. (John 18:3)

Notice what was said about David in 1 Samuel 16:13:

"The Spirit of God came upon David from that day forward.

### A LITTLE CLARIFICATION

- In the Old Testament, the Spirit of God came upon certain people so as to perform a certain task at a particular time.
- Therefore, the Spirit of God was not always controlling or motivating the Old Testament men & women.
- The Old Testament believers knew God personally, and they enjoyed His presence & guidance, but the Spirit of God was not always within or over them.
- Notice Gideon. In Judges 6:12, "The Lord is with you .."
- Notice Gideon again. In Judges 6:34, "The Spirit of the Lord came upon Gideon."
   a. These two conditions appear to be different in Gideon's life.

17. However, check out 1 Corinthians 3:16. Write it out.

- The Old Testament believers had the Spirit of God come over them only when God gave a task to do.
- The New Testament believers have the Spirit of God living in them as soon as they accept Christ as Savior.

# WAIT A MINUTE!! DAVID SINNED. HE KILLED; HE COMMITTED ADULTERY; HE HAD TOO MANY WIVES. GOD SAID TO HIM, "YOU HAVE DESPISED ME." (2 Sam. 12:10)

Check this out: 2 Samuel 12:13 - Nathan the prophet said to David [after his sin]. "The Lord has put away your sin; you shall not die."

The penalty for killing someone (not in war) was the **DEATH PENALTY**. The penalty for committing adultery was the **DEATH PENALTY**.

God loved the loyal, obedient, repentant heart that David had; He hated David's sin. **WHAT FORGIVENESS**. You get this forgiveness too. Your Comments. \_\_\_\_\_

# GOOD NEWS! <u>AFTER DAVID'S FAILURE & SIN</u>, HE STILL HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO PLEASE GOD. HE WAS ABLE TO MAKE CHANGES.

- 23. David repented & changed but his son, Absalom, was killed in battle. (2 Sam. 18:15) Why did David need this grief?
- 24. David repented & changed but he already had 8 wives & multiple concubines. Why was there an obsession with sex?

### WHAT'S LEFT FOR DAVID? (What's left for you and me?)

- He still had other children who he could point in the right direction.
- He had several wives & other sex partners he could seek healing for.
- He could try to make things right with those he had hurt & violated. If not, pray for them.
- He could pray for his children and ask God to grow them & protect them from his mistakes. "Oh God, give my son, Solomon, a loyal heart to keep your commandments, and to accomplish Your will." (1 Chr. 29:19) God did. "Solomon was strengthened in his kingdom, and the Lord was with him; God exceedingly exalted him." (2 Chr. 1:1)

Remember what David said after he sinned: <u>"I have sinned against the Lord"</u> (2 Sam. 12:13). He did not sin against Bathsheba; He did not sin against the child; He did not sin against Uriah. He hurt them & violated them BUT HE SINNED AGAINST GOD - SO, LET GOD REBUILD & HEAL THE PEOPLE YOU HAVE HURT. YOUR LIFE IS NOT OVER. YOU WERE NEVER WORTHLESS & YOU ARE NOT WORTHLESS NOW.
