## <u>Lesson 2D - How does God Communicate with us?</u>

Keep in mind that before people had (or wanted) access to the Bible, God used other ways.



## THROUGH DREAMS & VISIONS

- Ok, do not freak out. God did communicate to certain people this way in the Bible when He had a message to get out.
- Remember, they had no Bible to read, and the Holy Spirit was not constantly upon them. (The in-dwelling Holy Spirit came into believers in the book of Acts.
- Dreams & visions could have been new information from God back then.
- Now, we have all the information from God already in the Bible.
- People could have dreams now, of course, but the information given would be a reminder of information Gad has already given to us through His Spirit and in the Bible. NO NEW INFORMATION IS COMING FROM GOD NOW.

did what was right in their own eyes.  1 Samuel 1:1 - Now the boy Samuel ministered to the Lord before Eli the priest. And the word of the Lord was rare in those
days; there was no widespread revelation.

<ul> <li>Paul had a dream or vision from God because he would never have listened to anyone else.</li> </ul>
The availability of Bible books was scarce, or not always accessible to the common man.
