- *There are consequences for our sins; God wants us to understand that. One way to prove you understand is to tell God in prayer that "I messed up; I sinned".*
- *1 Cor. 10:4 says that the rock in Numbers was a symbol for the ROCK, Jesus.*
10. In Deut. 32:4-37, Moses finally realized (years later) that the Rock he was beating on:
Was perfect (4); would provide for him (13); would save him (15); created him (18); would punish justly (30); was the only God (31); would protect him (37).
 - a. Yes No Wasn't Moses really mad at God when he hit the rock twice?
 - b. Yes No Wouldn't it be better to say, "Lord, I am at fault here; change me."
 - c. Yes No Can you say, "I betrayed You Lord; forgive me; keep using me."
- *When I tell the Lord that I was wrong, His hug gets a little tighter.*
